

2022 has seen us achieve one of the main ambitions to produce a feature film with live soundtrack, envisaged at point of production and collaborating with the composer throughout the process. Developed since 2019, Dust & Metal had its world premiere at Sheffield DocFest 2022. Collaborating across three countries during Covid lockdowns and travel restrictions, this beautiful project has been completed against all the odds, and we cannot wait to spend 2023 sharing it with more audiences around the world.

Closer to home, we have returned to live events with some exciting collaborations (Make A Scene and Celluloid Screams) and 2023 will be an exciting time to be based in Yorkshire – our home district of Kirklees hosts Kirklees Year of Music 2023 for which we have some amazing events in the works, and we are excited to see the first steps towards Bradford UK City of Culture 2025. However, with the closure of key independent cinemas in recent months, the future of in person cinema events is far from a sure thing. As ever, we are dedicated to ensuring an incredible, diverse, and thriving cultural sector through adaptability, innovation, and collaboration.
